MUSIC NOTES

Tonight before and after High Mass, guest organist Michael Hey will play two movements from the Suite for Organ by Maurice Duruflé (1902-1986). The Sicilliene is a dance in 12/8 time with dotted rhythms. In his Sicilienne, Duruflé features the oboe sound accompanied by flutes in the left hand and pedal.

The Toccata from Duruflé's Suite is a fiery composition with furious passages in the hands and a dramatic, harsh theme in the pedal. Duruflé himself was never quite satisfied with his Toccata. It has become a regular recital piece however, and it demonstrates the pinnacle of organ technique.

During Communion the Parish Choir will sing the motet *Dixit Maria* by Hans Leo Hassler (1564-1612). Hassler sets this text from Luke 1 to intimate and simple vocal lines, perhaps reflecting the humility of Mary.

The choir will also sing the Kyrie, Gloria, and Agnus from Hassler's Missa super *Dixit Maria*. A parody mass, here Hassler parodies his own motet.







In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with the ever-blessed Virgin Mary and all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN.*
