MUSIC NOTES

Today before High Mass, St. Gregory's Choir will sing the motet *Principes gloriosissime* by Luca Marenzio (1556-1599). The text is for the Feast of St. Michael and All Angels which we celebrate today. Marenzio composed a stunningly beautiful motet, concluding with one of the greatest Alleluia sections.

Today the Choristers sing for the first time this season. During Communion they will sing the Eucharistic motet *Panis angelicus* by César Franck (1822-1890). They will be accompanied by organ and cello. Thank you to cellist Wayne Arndt for sharing his talent with us today. He will give a cello demonstration to the choristers after High Mass.

The organ piece after High Mass is *Litanies* by Jehan Alain (1911-1940). Alain lived a tragically short life; he was killed in a violent gun fight during World War II. His sister, Marie-Clarie Alain, went on to become one of the 20th century's most important organists, particularly through her recordings of J. S. Bach.

A litany is a series of prayers and supplications. The most notable litany used at Grace Church is the Great Litany, used on Sundays in Advent and Lent. Here Jehan Alain has set a musical litany. In the beginning of the piece, the trumpet announces the main theme. The shimmering choruses of the organ then take over, repeating the theme in many different moods and textures. The piece gradually builds, culminating in a huge outburst.



We acclaim you holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to your help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation.

Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new. And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete his work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

When the hour had come for him to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them he took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Father, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. right hand, awaiting his coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have give us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.

Remember all who minister in your Church. Remember all your people, and those who seek your truth. Remember all who have died in the peace of Christ, and those whose faith is known to you alone; bring them into the place of eternal joy and light. And grant that we may find our inheritance with the Blessed Virgin Mary, with patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and all the saints who have found favor with you in ages past. We praise you in union with them and give you glory through your Son Jesus Christ Our Lord.




