MUSIC NOTES

We are very lucky to have Timothy Brown with us as guest conductor this morning. He will lead St. Gregory's Choir in music of Benjamin Britten (1913-1976). All of the Britten pieces heard this morning will be performed at this afternoon's concert, in addition to many other of his works.

Britten's *Missa Brevis* was dedicated to the boys of the choir at Westminster Cathedral in London. Today we hear a different sound with the sopranos and countertenors of the choir singing. This mass is dramatic and rhythmically exciting, and it makes unusual usage of the organ's colors and foot pedals.

At Communion the choir will sing Britten's *Hymn to St. Peter*. In the final section of this anthem, Britten quotes the Alleluia for the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul found in the Roman Gradual.

The organ piece before High Mass is *Prelude and Fugue in D minor, BWV 539* by J. S. Bach (1685-1750). This Fugue was originally composed for solo violin; here Bach has arranged it for organ. He expanded the number of voices and recomposed a few sections, but the Fugue is just as effective.

After High Mass we will hear *Tiento no. 23* by Spanish composer Francisco Correa de Arauxo (1584-1654). Arauxo composed many *tientos*, and they are essentially long free-form compositions. *Tiento no. 23* is a piece inspired by the *Bataille de Morales*, a Spanish battle song. The concluding section of this *tiento* has an infectious dancing rhythm!





Some Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came to Jesus and asked him a question, “Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies, leaving a wife but no children, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother. Now there were seven brothers; the first married, and died childless; then the second and the third married her, and so in the same way all seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had married her.” Jesus said to them, “Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage; but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. Indeed they cannot die anymore, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. And the fact that the dead are raised Moses himself showed, in the story about the bush, where he speaks of the Lord as the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. Now he is God not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all of them are alive.”



We acclaim you holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to your help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation.

Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new. And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete his work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

When the hour had come for him to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them he took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Father, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ's death and his descent among the dead, proclaiming his resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting his coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have give us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.

Grant that all who share this bread and cup may become one body and one spirit, a living sacrifice in Christ, to the praise of your Name. Remember, Lord, your one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church, redeemed by the blood of your Christ. Reveal its unity, guard its faith, and preserve it in peace. Remember all who minister in your Church. Remember all your people, and those who seek your truth. Remember all who have died in the peace of Christ, and those whose faith is known to you alone; bring them into the place of eternal joy and light. And grant that we may find our inheritance with the Blessed Virgin Mary, with patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and all the saints who have found favor with you in ages past. We praise you in union with them and give you glory through your Son Jesus Christ Our Lord.





BRITTEN 100 CONCERT TODAY

The concert series continues today at 4:00 P.M. with a performance celebrating the 100th anniversary of the birth of Benjamin Britten (1913-1976). Britten was one of the 20th century's greatest composers. In addition to his sacred music, he wrote for nearly every type of instrument, and he composed many famous operas.

Our choirs will sing under guest conductor Timothy Brown. And tenor Andy McCullough will perform some of Britten's songs, accompanied by Joseph Arndt.

Timothy Brown was for 30 years Director of Music at Clare College in Cambridge, England, where he succeeded famous composer John Rutter. Mr. Brown made numerous recordings with the Clare Choir, particularly on the Naxos label. Many parishioners may remember that he and the Clare Choir sang for Advent Lessons & Carols in December 2009. Mr. Brown is arguably one of the world's greatest living choral conductors. Our parish community is very lucky to be hosting him.
