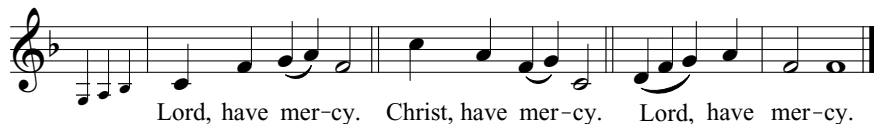

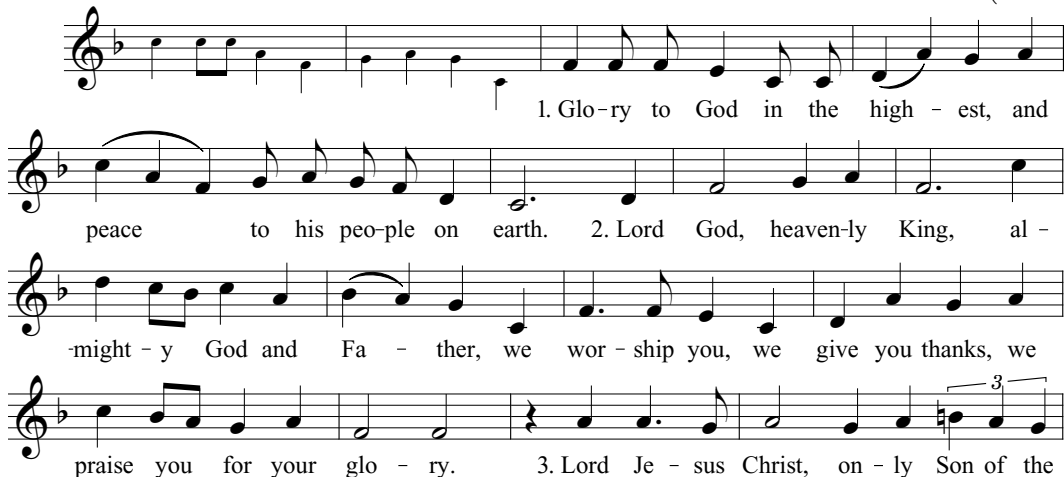

Reader A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans.

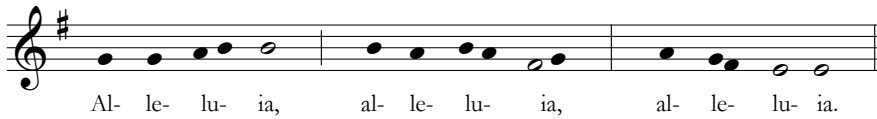

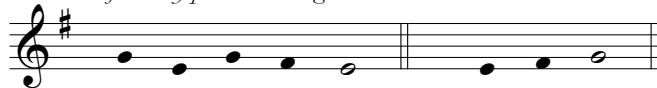
Prayers of the People

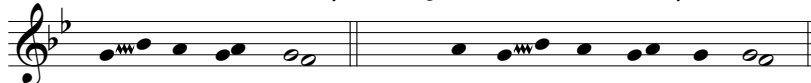

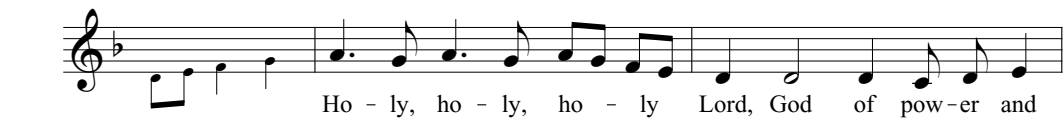

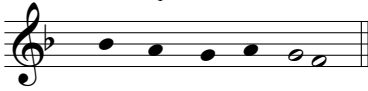
